At our hospitals...

- COVID-19 patients are isolated in the hospital, and negative-pressure airflow rooms are used to prevent contaminated air from leaving the room
- Xenex germ-zapping UV technology is used to decontaminate rooms
- COVID-19 testing before surgery that's available in-house to accelerate patient results
- Our care teams have the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) needed to keep you safe

At all of our care facilities...

- Social distancing practices in waiting rooms and common areas
- Screening patients, visitors, physicians and team members for COVID-19 symptoms, including temperature checks, prior to entry
- Requiring face covering or masks for all patients, visitors, physicians and team members
- Disinfecting and cleaning common areas is completed with increased frequency
- Increasing emphasis on existing infection prevention measures, such as clean hands only!
- Reduced visitation in place to maintain social distancing. Communication between care teams and loved ones remains a top priority through phone and video calls
